This Catalog Is Your Live Auction Paddle, So Please Remember to Bring It with You on Saturday Evening, November 8, 2025.

Admission is \$30 per person, \$55 per couple, \$15 children 12 and younger and entitles you to: a Bidding Number (one number per household) and a great meal: appetizers, drinks, dinner, dessert and coffee.

This catalogue contains descriptions and item numbers for Live Auction and Silent Auction goods and services. All Silent Auction items will be displayed on tables near their bid sheets.

You are encouraged to review the items early and plan your strategies ahead of time. Many of the large ticket items can be purchased by a group. Find other people you'd like to dine or vacation with, agree on a maximum bid, choose a single bidder, and go for it! The winning bid can be recorded only on the bidder's bill, with the members of the group settling up among themselves later. Note: The cashier's table will not split bids. Good luck and have an enjoyable evening!

Auction Types and How They Work

You have the opportunity to compete for items and services in three ways:

Live Auction – Bid in real time against others by displaying your paddle during active bidding.

Silent Auction – Bid by clearly writing your name, paddle number and bid on the sheets posted on the walls. Read the item's description about how to bid carefully, and keep checking back to see if you need to increase your bid! These sheets are already up in the Sanctuary, and bidding has begun. Silent auction items are of three types:

YELLOW ~ Incremental Bid Auction Items, Single Winner

Only one bidder can win. Highest bid wins.

GREEN ~ Incremental Bid Auction Items, Multiple Winners

Multiple winners possible. When the maximum number of people have signed up at the "starting bid," additional bidders must sign up at the next price level (the same number of bidders can bid at that next price level). Price increments are indicated on the sign-up sheet. At the end of the auction, the winners will be picked as follows: Highest bidders win. If there are more slots than the number of highest bidders, then the first bidders at the next highest price fill the remaining slots.

BLUE ~ Fixed Price Auction Items, Unlimited # of Winners

Last in at the lower bid is the first out.

Example: Japanese dinner for 6. Starting bid: \$50. Bid increments: \$10

First 6 bidders bid \$50 each. 4 more bidders bid \$60 each.

The four \$60 bidders will win, and the first two \$50 bidders will win.

Notes:

If you are a couple, you must enter **a separate bid for each person**. In cases where one person in a couple wins and one loses, the losing partner may opt to buy in at the higher, winning price, if the donor is able to accommodate the additional person.

If you are outbid and choose to bid again at a higher bid price, please remember to **cross off your old bids**.

Sgraffito (with an S) is a primary art medium where a design is scratched into multiple layers of plaster. This technique involves scratching through the nearly dry plaster to reveal various colors or textures of the different underlying layers, creating images or patterns. This 9" round hanging Sgraffito plaque has a narrow lined border surrounding the off-white plaster background with a gray-blue stream meandering through reddish-brown mountains. A crimson sun shines over trees with bare wintry branches made up of ultra-fine lines scratched deeply

into the layers begins with multiple layers of colored plaster through which the artist gently scratches through the delicate layers until a beautiful design emerges. Donated by Linda Kirk. 1 winner, opening bid \$20.

The combination of wool and silk adds depth and texture, yet each one is lightweight and unbreakable. Perfect for use as decorative sculpture, yet each can hold light objects such as a stem of dried flowers or be used as catch all for small treasures.
