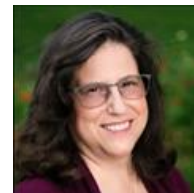

Beloveds,

Back in the fall, I planted some tulip bulbs in my little patch in front of my condo here. I think planting bulbs or seeds is always an act of faith. I never thought of myself as a gardener—I once under-watered a cactus! Nevertheless, with a little care and attention, I think anyone can care for new plant life.

My act of faith has borne fruit, and as I write, green shoots and leaves have sprung forth. I will only be able to enjoy these tulips for this one spring before I leave Long Island. Yet I hope that they will give joy to whoever lives in my condo next.

Being in religious community together is a bit like planting a garden. We do things together, we lay groundwork for things, we start new initiatives and ministries, and we have faith that they will bear fruit. And that fruit isn't just for those of us who are here now, but, we hope, for those who will come afterwards.

You have been planting a lot of seeds and bulbs during my time with you here. Soon you will be voting on a new minister, and also on the merger with the UU Congregation of the Great South Bay! You'll be choosing a new name for this new merged congregation. And you'll be preparing for the next ministry. How exciting!

All of these things are acts of faith. You can't know all the things that will be springing forth from your new endeavors. But by working faithfully together you will nurture what you create, and it will be beautiful.

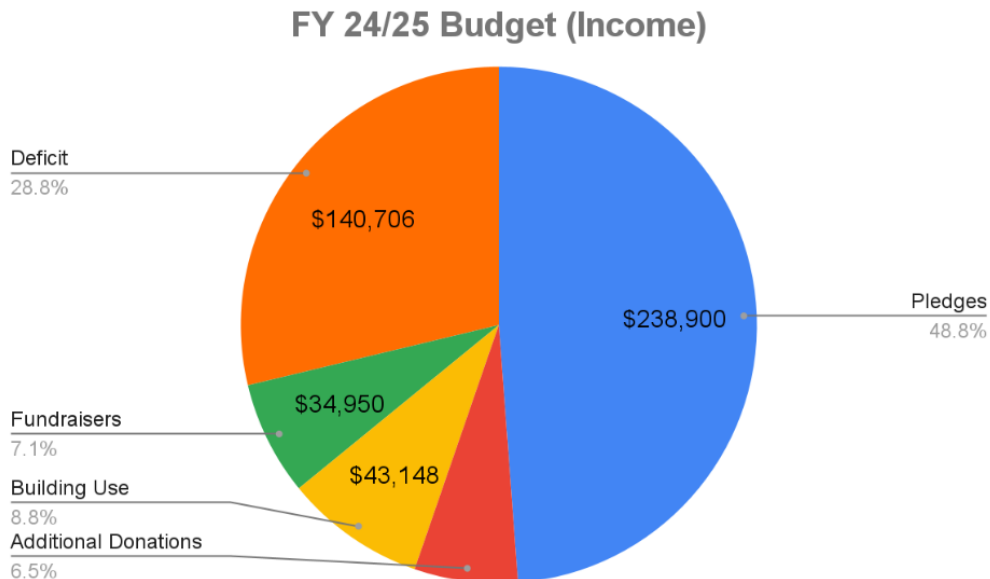

BULLETINS FROM THE BOARD

Spring is here and with it comes the excitement of the blooming crocuses, tulips, daffodils and forsythia in my yard. And at the Fellowship we have growing excitement as we anticipate the announcement of a new settled minister after a long search. If you have a moment, please express your gratitude and appreciation to the **Search Committee** for the long hours that they have been putting in over this past year to find our next minister. You can find a list of committee members at uufsb.org/about-us/ministerial-search.



The board is hopeful that our **Stewardship Campaign** will bring in enough pledges to support us without having to make any difficult cuts to our budget. However, unless we increase our income substantially, we will be operating with another deficit next year. The **Finance Committee** put together this pie chart that shows our budget if our pledges stay the same this year. The orange “slide” of the pie shows the deficit that we could have for next year.



This pie chart is based on our historical pledge amounts and a very aspirational budget with additional items that we hoped to include this year. If we aren't able to increase our pledge income, we will need to reduce our expenses, and we are anticipating another large deficit.

If you haven't already, please submit your pledge by the end of this month. To ensure our fellowship continues to grow and flourish, we need your continued support.

Together, we can ensure that our Unitarian Universalist Fellowship remains a vibrant and welcoming center for spiritual growth, social justice action, and connection. Thank you for your continued support.

Summer Services – Call for Speakers on “My Spiritual Story”: Deadline for Service Proposals Is April 12

Where did you come from, spiritually speaking, who are you, and where are you going? We all want to know! Here is your chance to tell us!



Each year we ask members of our congregation to consider leading a service during the summer based on a topic that can be discussed from several different perspectives. The theme for our services this summer will be “My Spiritual Story.”

We all have a story to tell about how we came to this Fellowship. Some of us have been life-long UU's, some came from other faith traditions, some came to provide a spiritual foundation for their children and some have searched far and wide to find a sacred home where they belong.

If it would help, feel free to consult with one of the WAs as you put your ideas to paper.

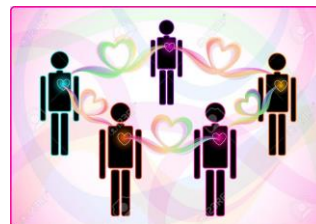

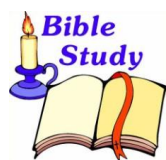
